TWO KEY QUESTIONS

- 1. How important is the issue?
- 2. How important is the relationship?

1. AVOID

If the issue is unimportant and the relationship is unimportant.

2. COMPETE

If the issue is important and the relationship is unimportant.

3. ACCOMODATE

If the issue is unimportant and the relationship is important.

4. COMPROMISE

If the issue is important and the relationship is important. (But there is room for 'give and take' on both sides.)

5. COLLABORATE

If the issue is important and the relationship is important.

3 CONFLICT PRINICIPLES

- 1. No one has to be wrong.
- 2. Understand that you have a limited perspective.
- 3. Give the other person the benefit of the doubt.
